The theme of the CLSD meeting: Get up close and personal with local Lawyers and Advocates from legal and advocacy services in Dubbo.

Purpose of meeting: This meeting was for community and disability sector workers who wanted to learn about legal services available in Dubbo and how to make referrals to these services.
