

Moree CLSD Action Plan

2023 - 2025

Fines and fine debt are relatively high in the region, with the total value of overdue fines totalling over \$3.5 million as of May 2023. Over \$2.6 million of this debt is over 2 years old and nearly 100 people have had their license suspended. We would like to find creative and collaborative ways to reduce the burden of this fine debt on people experiencing economic and social disadvantage

in the region, particularly those aged between 18-24 years (with an overdue fine debt of approximately \$300, 000)

We need more forms of diversion in the community for young people and adults involved in the criminal justice system. In the 3 years up to September 2022 the number of young people being taken to court by police in the region has increased with 248 young people taken to court in the 12 months to September 2022.
